

The original and each copy of an application for a passport must have attached to it a copy of the applicant's photograph.  
A loose signed photograph of the applicant must accompany the application.  
The photograph must be on thin paper, should have a light background, and be not over three inches in size.

This blank must be completely filled out. The legal fee of nine dollars, in currency or postal money order, must accompany the application.

A woman's application must state whether she is married or not, and a married woman must state whether her husband is a native citizen.

The rules should be carefully read before mailing the application to the Department of State, Division of Passport Control, Washington, D. C.

The total cost of a passport is \$10.00. It is unnecessary to pay any other fee to any person in connection with the filling out or execution of this application or for obtaining the passport. The clerk of the Department of State or Passport Agent before whom this application is executed will give the applicant all necessary information and guidance.

I solemnly swear that I was born at Canton, China, in the State of China, on or about the 12 day of October, 1898;\* that my { father } Woo Bok King was born in San Francisco, Cal. and is now residing at No. 207 W. Broadland Park Boulevard, Richmond, Va.  
\*[that he emigrated to the United States from the port of San Francisco, Cal. on or about 1 that he resided 24 years, uninterruptedly, in the United States, from 1 to 1, at Richmond, Va.; that he was naturalized as a citizen of the United States before the 1 Court of Richmond, Va. on 1, as shown by the accompanying Certificate of Naturalization; that I have resided outside of the United States at the following places for the following periods:

China, from date of birth to April, 1915  
Richmond, Va., from April, 1915 to Feb. 7, 1918
